TERRIBLE BATTLE IN POLAND. RUSSIA'S IMMENSE SACRIFICES.

ENEMY BRING UP REINFORCEMENTS. Interesting Tour by Professor Pares. AUSTRIAN ARMY A RELIC OF ITS FORMER SELF!

The Press Bureau this morning issued a communication received from Professor Pares, the authorised correspondent at the Russian Headquarters, writing under date January 1st. Professor Pares says:— At this Staff, as at the General Staff, he was very ample. There was plenty of news from other quarters of the Russian front, and two things which stood out even more here than elsewhere were, on the one hand, the immensity of the sacrifices which are being cheerfully made by Russia, and on the other, the sense of quiet confidence as to the final result.

OUR TROOPS HAVE CONSOLIDATED THEIR POSITION NEAR THE VILLAGE OF GROSSEMINNEN ON THE LEFT BANK OF THE ANGERAP. ON THE RIGHT BANK OF THE VISUTLA COLLISIONS WITH THE ENEMY HAVE BECOME MORE FREQUENT.

OUR TROOPS CARRIED BY ASSAULT THE TOWN OF SKEMPE, AND REPELLED THE ENEMY'S ATTEMPTED ATTACK ON THE VILLAGE OF BLOD, CAUSING HIM HEAVY LOSSES. HERE WE CAPTURED THE COMMANDER OF A BATTALION OF INFANTRY OFFICERS, AND A HUNDRED SOLDIERS.

ON THE LEFT BANK OF THE VISUTLA THE FIGHT ON THE FRONT PROMPTLY CONTINUED. THE ENEMY BROUGHT INTO HIS FIRST LINE OF ACTION MORE THAN FOURTEEN REGIMENTS AND GREAT MASSES OF ARTILLERY INCLUDING HEAVY GUNS, WHICH CEASE FIRE NEITHER BY DAY NOR NIGHT.

THE ENEMY CONTINUES TO BRING UP FRESH REINFORCEMENTS. DEMONSTRATIONS BY THE ENEMY ON THE RIVER HAVE NOT BEEN SUCCESSFUL. THE FIGHTING IN THE CARPATIANS IS DEVELOPING BECOMING MORE AND MORE DETERMINED.

CONSIDERABLE GERMAN FORCES ARE ARRIVING. THE LAST SENTENCE CONTAINS THE FOLLOWING:— IT IS ANNOUNCED THAT ON FEBRUARY 22 RUSSIAN AVIATORS SUCCESSFULLY BOMBED THE GATHERINGS OF GERMAN RESERVES AND ON GERMAN TRAINS AT REZEKZEI AND BOGUCHEV.
