LATE WAR NEWS. MURDEROUS MINES. HULL TRAWLER BLOWN UP. SKIPPERS AND ONE HAND LOST.

PARIS, SUNDAY. FIGHTING CONTINUES ON OCEAN FRONT. THE ADVANCED DEFENCE FORCES OF THE GERMAN ARMY HAVE ASSUMED LARGER PROPORTIONS TO THAT OF THE ALLIES. ADVANCED TO OUBRE WITHOUT GREAT RESISTANCE.

GERMAN LINES REPORTED "TURNED." A Times' telegram, dated Boulogne, Sunday, says: "The Mayor of Boulogne is reported to have received a telegram this morning stating that General Coffin had succeeded in turning the German lines, and Sir John French has got round on the left of the German position."

RUSSIAN ADVANCE. HOME, Monday. Russian official reports say that Russian troops are gradually surrounding the German fortified town of Przemyśl, some 25 miles west of Lemberg.

GERMANY OFFENSIVE CHINA. GRAVE ACCUSATION FROM PEKIN. Monday. A Peking message received here declares that China accuses Germany of violating the terms of the Twenty-One Demands.

LUCKY ACCT OF LAD OF 18. "Daily Chronicle" special correspondent writes from the front: "A young lad of 18, who was reported to be missing, has been found safe."

JAPAN'S WAR VOTE. TOKYO, Monday. The House of Representatives has announced a vote of 200 to 100 in favour of the 25,000,000 sterling loan.

KAISER AT METZ. PARIS, Monday. The Kaiser's Bath carriage, with the Emperor and the Grand Duke, is reported to be at Metz.

HOW THE PATHEFRIDER FOUND. VESSELS RACE TO THE RESCUE. DESTROYED IN FOUR MINUTES.

THE Pathefrider, a small motor launch, was destroyed in four minutes on Saturday night. The vessel was racing to the rescue of a German trawler which was being attacked by a submarine.

FISHERMEN AND NORTH SEA MINES. A meeting of the German trawler owners was held today for the purpose of considering the situation with regard to the mines in the North Sea.

GERMAN WANTS TO ENLIST. As Liverpool today, Wilhelm Wurst, a German, has been arrested for attempting to make a false declaration in two statements for the British Army.

GERMAN'S JOURNEY FROM HULL. A German, who was reported to be missing, has been found safe. He was on his way to the front.

GERMAN'S AND JAPANESE PRISONERS. Shortly before Japan's war declaration the greater number of Japanese living in Germany were arrested.
